| <p>My first meeting of the SIG, which looks after the entire UK Coastal region. Highlights of the meeting are shown below, a full copy of the notes is available should anyone require them.</p> <p>New Members of the SIG were warmly welcomed by the Chair, including the Isle of Wight Council who recently joined.</p> <p>The Group discussed the Government's updated response to the Future of Seaside Towns report.</p> <p>Members agreed to support the paper put forward by the Chair of the Coastal Group Network to ask for the re-establishment of the Coastal Research, Development and Dissemination Group to set out research priorities for managing flood and coastal erosion</p> <p>Unfortunately our speaker on the Coastal Concordat was ill and unable to attend.</p> <p>There was positive news that the Government has now adopted and published Marine Plans for the North East, North West, South East and South West which means for the first time all of England's seas are covered by a plan.</p> <p>DEFRA are launching a Call for Evidence shortly regarding activities exempt from Marine licensing.</p> <p>The technical phase of the Shoreline Management Plan review has been completed and the local consultation phase has begun</p> <p>Water safety concerns and planning were discussed ahead of the busiest summer ever, with a National update given by the RNLI. We also heard about local successes from Dorset Council.</p> <p>The Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) have published their Tourism Recovery Plan</p> <p>Members were shown a presentation on the pilot Surf Conservation Area being proposed in North Devon. It was supported in principle by Members</p> <p>The comedian Joe Lycett presented his campaign on the sale of cheap body boards and the implementation of local bans by the Plastic Free Community of Torridge in North Devon. Retail businesses now only sell more expensive and durable body boards, or wooden ones.</p> | |
