My name is Jan Malpas and I am the Chairman of Beach and Sea Access Topic Team who are a group of members of the public supporting Beach and Sea Access in Bognor Regis. Two of our members were part of ADC's Working Party for Beach Access for All. My Question for the Committee is:- For continuation of Beach and Sea Access for All in Bognor Regis into 2024 and beyond, ADC need to provide a budget for quotations of selected schemes in order than funding can be applied for. Will ADC do this?

## Response

Thank you for your question.

As you will have seen there is an update report due to be presented to this Committee today giving the latest position on this initiative. The report identifies progress against the objectives agreed by the Committee earlier this year and sets out next steps. This includes further stakeholder engagement. Specific projects to improve access for all will require stakeholder engagement to ensure emerging projects are fully supported and are sustainable in the long term. The report identifies improvements for ramps and lists funding partners. It is anticipated that funding for projects will come from a variety of sources once projects to improve access have been agreed.
