**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:** This report asks Members to consider the matter of an application for the variation of a premises licence for Best Kebab, 18 Queensway, Bognor Regis

**RECOMMENDATIONS:** It is recommended that the Members consider application and make an appropriate decision from the options available to them at section 3.0 of this report.

#### 1. BACKGROUND:

#### 1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 Mr Mehmet Karakus has made an application to vary a premises licence under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The premise is subject to an existing premises licence for the provision of late night refreshment.
- 1.3 The premises is situated on a main thoroughfare where there is a mix of residential and business properties.
- 1.4 The premise is a small fast food outlet with a maximum of 8 covers and operates only at street level.
- 1.5 The variation to the application is for the following licensable activities:

1.6 The current licence is for:

Supply of Alcohol	No alcohol currently being supplied
Hours open to the public	13.00 to 01.00 Monday to Wednesday 13.00 to 03.00 Thursdays 13.00 to 04.00 Friday and Saturday 13.00 to 01.00 Sunday
Licence condition	On all days when the licence permits the premises to remain open after 01.00, a licensed and registered door supervisor will be deployed on the premises from 01.30 until the premises closes. The person deployed in this capacity will not perform any other role whilst performing door supervision activities.

- 1.7 Representations against the application have been received from Licensing authority, Environmental Health, Regeneration team, Sussex police and Bognor Regis Town Council. The representations are considered valid tin regards to the licensing objectives, The Subcommittee may only consider those points within representations which are relevant in terms of the Act and relate to the licensing objectives.
- 1.8 The applicant was advised of the nature of the representations and responded to Licensing on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2018, that the SIA door staff will remain and to reduce the hours for the sale of alcohol, however he did not provided any times for which the sale of alcohol will take place.
- 1.9 On 14<sup>th</sup> December 2018 the applicant responded to the police representation stating that he would wish to remove the SIA door supervisor on Fridays and to keep the SIA door supervisor on Saturdays. He also stated he would reduce the sale of alcohol on:

Sundays to Wednesday 13.00 to Midnight Thursday to Saturday 13.00 to 02.00

The applicant has stated they wish to keep the existing conditions and operating schedule, but refers to any other condition to be added to the licence to promote the licensing objectives

1.10 At the present time there is no sanitary accommodation in the premises for customers. The guidance for sanitary accommodation in a food business states: 'Restaurants, cafes, fast food outlets and canteens with 0-8 seats = no minimum sanitary requirements required'.

#### 2.0 POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

Aruns policy states:

- 5.10 Arun District Council acknowledge that licensing law is not a mechanism for the general control of anti-social behaviour by people once they are beyond the direct control of the individual, club or business holding a licence, certificate or relevant permission. However, the Licensing Authority believes a level of responsibility for customer or member behaviour clearly exists beyond the site boundary. The Licensing Authority will seek compelling evidence linking incidents that occur away from particular premises when making decisions concerning licences, certificates or notices. The control of anti-social behaviour away from licensed premises, qualifying clubs and temporary events is primarily a matter for the Police but the individual, club or business holding a licence, certificate or relevant permission will be expected to work in co-operation with the Police to ensure that, wherever possible, anti-social behaviour away from premises and events is minimised.
- 6.2 This policy shall avoid unnecessary duplication or inefficiencies by properly separating the planning and licensing regimes in operation.
- 8.2 The licensing committee or its subcommittee licensing authority is only able to impose additional conditions that are clearly proportionate and appropriate following relevant representation made to the authority or that are agreed with the applicant. Such conditions will only be imposed if appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The licensing authority may act in its capacity as a responsible authority and raise representations in relation to an application if it deems it appropriate to do so.
- 11.5 The Council may require stricter (noise) conditions where the premises are situated in an area primarily of a residential nature.

#### 3.0 OBSERVATIONS

- 3.1 The Subcommittee is obliged to determine the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:
  - i) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
  - ii) The Prevention of Public Nuisance
  - iii) Protection of Children from Harm
  - iv) Public Safety
- 3.2 In making its decision the Subcommittee is also obliged to have regard to national guidance and Arun's Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 3.3 The Subcommittee must also have regard to all relevant representations and evidence that it hears

office standards and shall be kept operational at all times the premises are open to the public.    b) It shall be capable of taking a head & shoulders shot of persons entering the premises, of recording images to an
evidential standard in any light and be capable of storing images for a minimum of 31 days.
c) All staff who may work front of house shall be trained to operate the cctv system and download images.
d) At least one member of staff trained to operate the cctv system & download images shall be on duty at all times the
premises are open to the public. Footage shall be shown to the police and screenshots provided to them on request.
Copies of downloaded images shall be provided to the police on a usb stick, cd or other acceptable means as soon as
possible and in any case within 24 hours of the request
3) challenge 25 shall be operated as the proof of age policy.
4) all staff who work at the till will be trained for their role on induction and be given refresher training every six months.  Written training records will be kept for each staff member and be produced to police & authorised council officers on
request. Training will include identifying persons under 25, making a challenge, acceptable proof of age & checking it,
making & recording a refusal, avoiding conflict & responsible alcohol retailing.
5) An incident book shall be kept at the premises, and made available to the police or authorised council officers, which w
record the following:
A) All crimes reported,
B) Lost property, C) All ejections of customers,
D) Any complaints received,
E) Any incidents of disorder,
F) Any seizure of drugs or offensive weapons,
G) Any faults in the cctv,
H) Any refusal in the sale of alcohol.
Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service     Notices will be prominently displayed by the entry/ exit door and point of sale (as appropriate) advising customers:
A) That cctv & challenge 25 are in operation;
B) Advising customers of the provisions of the licensing act regarding underage & proxy sales;
C) Of the permitted hours for licensable activities & the opening times of the premises;
D) To respect residents, leave quietly, not to loiter outside the premises or in the vicinity and to dispose of litter legally.

# c) Public safety

A fire risk assessment and emergency plan will be prepared and regularly reviewed. All staff will receive appropriate fire safety training and refresher training.

## d) The prevention of public nuisance

- 1) The front of the premises shall be kept tidy at all times and be swept at close.
- Relevant notices will be prominently displayed by the entry/ exit door and point of sale (as appropriate)
- 3) No deliveries will be received or rubbish removed from the premises between 22.00 & 07.00.
- 4) Any music played will only be played at background level.
- 5) An incident book shall be kept at the premises and made available to the police or authorized council officers –see box b condition 5 for full details of the information to be recorded.
- 6) A phone number for the premises shall be made available if required upon request to the police, any other responsible authority or any local resident to express any concerns caused by the operation of the premises. Any complaints and the outcome will be recorded in the incident book.

# e) The protection of children from harm

- 1) Challenge 25 shall be operated as the proof of age policy and only a valid passport, photo driving license, hm forces photographic id card or proof of age card with the pass logo or hologram on it may be accepted as proof of age.
- 2) All refusals of the sale of alcohol shall be recorded in the refusals section of the incident book. The incident book shall be kept and produced to police & authorized council officers on request –see section b condition 5 for full details.
- 3) Relevant notices will be prominently displayed by the entry/ exit door and point of sale as appropriate see section B condition 6 for full details.
- 4) All staff who work front of house will be trained for their role on induction and be given refresher training every six months. Written training records will be kept for each staff member and be produced to police & authorized council officers on request. Training will include identifying persons Under 25, making a challenge, acceptable proof of age & checking it, making & recording a refusal, avoiding conflict & responsible alcohol retailing.
- All alcohol shall be ancillary to the operation of the premises as a mainly takeaway restaurant. Alcohol may only be supplied with a substantial food order.
- 6) All alcohol will be displayed and kept and will be sold from behind the counter and to be dispensed by a member of staff only
- 7) The delivery of alcohol to be made only to a residential or business address, where it is clearly evident that the customer is a resident or occupies the business.
- 8) The delivery of alcohol will not be made to a person in a public place such as a street corner, park or bus stop etc.
- 9) Customers to be reminded it is a criminal offence for a person under 18 years to purchase or attempt to purchase alcohol and that it is also an offence to purchase alcohol on behalf of a person aged under 18 years
- 10) ID verification will be made when orders containing alcohol are delivered (no ID no delivery) acceptable proof of age shall include identification bearing the customer's photograph, date of birth and integral holographic mark or security measure
- 11) All serving and delivery staff shall receive regular training, a minimum of twice a year on the prevention of underage sales and on Challenge 25 scheme.





Whilst the Committee did not object to the scheduled days/timings to supply alcohol, Members **RESOLVED** to **OBJECT** to the application for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises on the following grounds:- Prevention of crime and disorder; and the prevention of public nuisance.

There were concerns over alcohol being available to purchase at such an early hour, especially due to where this premises is situated in the Town Centre, and the potential for issues with street drinkers and antisocial behavior in nearby areas such as the Sunken Gardens and Queensway car park. The Town Council has been working successfully with other organisations and the police to address the situation of street drinking in Bognor Regis and this application goes against this work.

#### Objection to variation application for Best Kebab, Queensway, Bognor Regis

Environmental Health would like to raise an objection to the application to vary the above licence on the following grounds:

#### **The Prevention of Public Nuisance**

The applicant seeks permission for the sale of alcohol during its opening hours, (Sunday - Wednesday from 1pm – 1am, Thursday from 1pm – 3am and Friday and Saturday from 1pm – 4am). They also seek to remove the need for SIA registered door staff. There are residential flats directly above and opposite the premises as well as in the surrounding street. The proposed extended hours for the consumption of alcohol combined with the lack of supervision would give rise to a **strong** potential for public nuisance due to noise from customers e.g. from customers shouting, loud talking etc. This is compounded by the fact that at 3-4am the background noise in the area will be quiet e.g. no traffic, so any noise from customers inside or outside the shop will be magnified and are more likely to cause a nuisance to residents nearby.

#### **The Prevention of Crime & Disorder**

This local area has already been identified as an area dealing with anti-social behaviour relating to the night time economy. Therefore the proposed extension to the hours that alcohol is sold could fuel more of this behaviour with customers drinking into the early hours of the morning.

# Objection to variation application for Best Kebab, Queensway, Bognor Regis

I act on behalf of the Licensing Authority as a Responsible Authority. The authority is in receipt of a variation application dated 12/11/18. It is contended that the application if granted will undermine the licensing objectives of The Prevention of Crime & Disorder and the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

Essentially the variation seeks:

- Removal of the requirement for use of SIA registered door staff at the premises
- Addition of the sale of alcohol

The above two proposals being made in tandem are alarming to officers, especially in the locality of the premises which is a known anti-social behaviour hot spot. There is concern that the applicant has not considered the needs of the community together with the needs of his business, this being evidenced through the contradictory nature of the proposal. Removing door staff whilst proposing to sell alcohol and failing to offer any adequate alternatives to mitigate the risks that arise from such an activity is considered unacceptable.

Traditionally late night refreshment licences have been granted to such establishments with hours later than nearby alcohol licensed premises with a view to customers being able to purchase hot food and or drink on their way out of the area which accommodates the individual needs whilst assisting to wind down the evening and disperse customers gradually. This application seeks to continue supply of alcohol until between 0100hrs and 0400hrs depending on the day of the week.

The operating schedule proposes conditions that appear to have been lifted from another application in another area, indeed even referring to the wrong police force. Although the content is substantial in wording it lacks enforceable and clear steps that the applicant will take to ensure that his business does not adversely impact on the local amenity and undermine the licensing objectives.

This local area is focus for authorities working to deal with issues of anti-social behaviour relating to the night time economy. The applicant has not proposed any measures that will suitably mitigate the impact of continued supply of alcohol in this area at such hours of the morning and no consideration appears to have been given to the needs of the local amenity.

Proposed steps in the operating schedule include the maintenance of records and the implementation of proof of age policies. Officers across agencies have commented that they have observed that English language skills of staff appear to be a barrier to communication. It is unclear how the applicant will be able to uphold his obligations if staff cannot effectively communicate with customers.

It is proposed that on and off sales of alcohol may be supplied to those purchasing a 'substantial meal'. The term 'substantial meal' is not defined. The applicant will have no control over customers once they leave the vicinity of the premises and consume alcohol in the streets with their food at the end of an evening.

For those consuming alcohol on the premises in the small amount of seating available, it is proposed that no SIA registered staff are required. In addition there appears to no toilet accessible. Officers have concern of the effects of supply of alcohol at these premises on immediate and wider areas.

The Licensing Authority granting a licence for provision of alcohol (or indeed the operation of a late night refreshment premises) with no SIA registered door staff at such late hours on such a regular basis, in an area with residential accommodation above would not be considered to be fulfilling obligations to promote the licensing objectives in the proposed circumstances.
