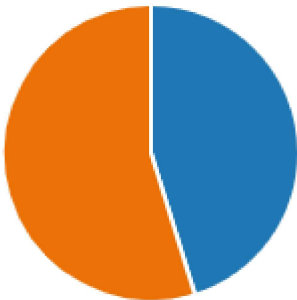

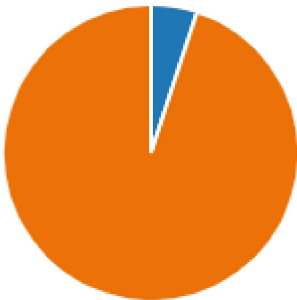
1. Are you a Dog owner?

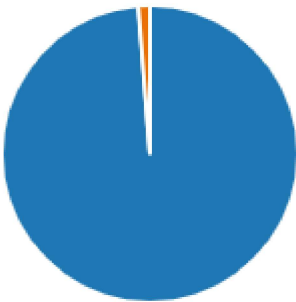

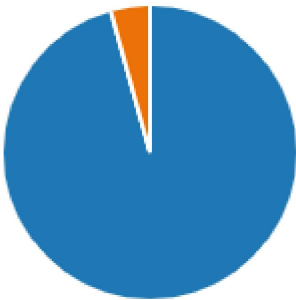

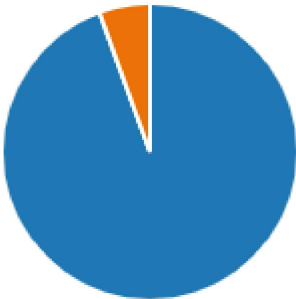
3. Do you support the continued use of the Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) to require dog owners to remove dog faeces?

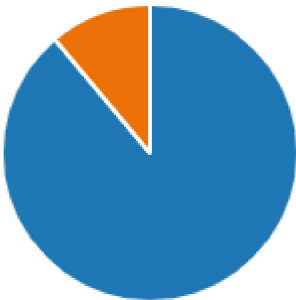

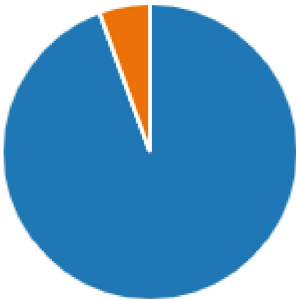

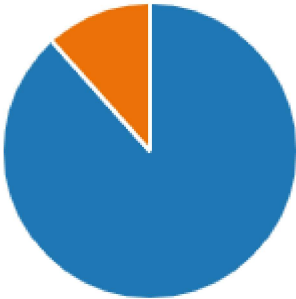
7. Do you support the continued use of the existing PSPO to enable an authorised officer to require a dog owner to put their dog on a lead?
