**Licensing Act 2003 – Notice of Determination and other matters.  
Re: Fox Inn, Arundel Road, Patching, Worthing, West Sussex, BN13 3UJ**

As you may be aware, the Fox Appeal Licensing Hearing was listed for Monday 10<sup>th</sup> June 2024 at the Magistrates Court and Cerys Sayer from Westgate Chambers was appointed to attend on behalf of the Council.

You (Mr Boxall) did not attend despite various correspondence sent to you over the last month prior to the hearing and that it was noted that you had not engage with the appeal or prosecution.

With the Court being satisfied that you were made aware of the hearing, the appeal was dismissed by the Court for non-attendance.

The Court appeal hearing is now technically disposed of, which means that the decision of the Licensing sub-committee on 6 March 2023 therefore now stands and the imposed new conditions form part of the operating schedule to be included in the new day to day running of your business.

**Imposed New Conditions attached to Fox Inn Premises Licence**

Please note, that YOU should carefully read the new imposed conditions attached to your licence and in particular, may we draw to your attention the following :-

- **the prevention of live or recorded music or amplified speech taking place in the marquee or other outside areas until they have met certain requirements.**
- **The reduced hours for any amplified music or amplified voices in outdoor areas including the marquee, limited to 12.00 to 22.00 Monday to Saturday and 12.00 to 21.30 on Sundays and bank holidays.**

We must make you aware, that failure to adhere to these or any of the other conditions attached to your licence, you could get a maximum fine of £20,000 and/ or six months imprisonment and that you may be prosecuted for each condition that is being breached.

A responsible authority or interested party can apply to review a premises or club premises certificate. Where they can provide evidence that the licensing objectives are not being addressed by breaches of conditions.

You could therefore be prosecuted, and the licence or certificate is reviewed which could end in revocation, suspension or loss of hours or licensable activities.

There will also be routine monitoring checks carried out by authorised officers for compliance purposes, and we strongly advise that you to comply with terms and conditions of your Premises Licence.
