#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

In accordance with the provisions of the Officer Scheme of Delegation in the Council's Constitution, this report updates the Cabinet on a decision taken by Officers to incur expenditure or take urgent action in response to the Coronavirus emergency.

This has been included as an urgent item as the report was not prepared ahead of the agenda preparation timetable and this is the first opportunity to report the decision taken in line with the Council's Constitution.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

The Cabinet is asked to note and support the actions taken by Officers.

#### 1. BACKGROUND:

- 1.1 Responding to the Coronavirus pandemic is the first peacetime national emergency that the Council has had to face. It has brought unprecedented challenges that officers have been responding to, on behalf of the Council, since early March. The latest national lockdown led to the need for an urgent decision to be taken to ensure that the Council could support its commercial tenants who were impacted by restrictions imposed by Central Government.
- 1.2 The Council had prepared for such a situation with the emergency provisions included within the Officer Scheme of Delegation in its Constitution. The two key provisions are:
  - Group Heads and above have the power, in an emergency, to take such action as
    is necessary within the law to protect life, health and safety, the economic, social
    or environmental well-being of the District and to preserve property belonging to
    the Council or others (Part 4, Section 1, paragraph 1.9); and
  - The Chief Executive, Director of Services and Director of Place have authority to incur expenditure for meeting the purposes of Local Government Act 1972, S.138 in connection with peacetime emergencies and disasters, subject to reporting their actions to the first subsequent meeting of Cabinet (Part 4, Section 2,

paragraphs 2.11).

- 1.3 The Officer Scheme of Delegation also gives the Chief Executive, Directors and Group Heads operational decision-making authority to maintain Council services as much as possible (Part 4, Sections 1 to 3).
- 1.4 Transparency in decision making has been maintained through consultation with the Leader of the Council and the Cabinet Member for Technical Services.

- 2.1 This meeting is the first opportunity for Officers to report the recorded emergency decision taken in line with their delegated authority at Part 4, Section 2, Paragraphs 2.11 of the Officer Scheme of Delegation.
- 2.2 Cabinet is asked to note and support the action taken by officers.
